Lowe's Fernandez Racing comes to the American Le Mans Series with an extensive background in many forms of motorsports.

In 2007, the Indianapolis-based organization debuted its new Lowe's Acura Lola sports car in spectacular fashion with a third place overall in the prestigious Mobil 1 12 Hours of Sebring, one of the most difficult sports-car races in the world.

Drivers Adrian Fernandez and Luis Diaz, both Mexican racing stars, continued their impressive performance with strong runs throughout the 12-race American Le Mans Series, including podium finishes at Mid-Ohio and Laguna Seca.

As one of North America's top racing organizations, Lowe's Fernandez Racing had been successful in a variety of racing categories over the previous decade before taking on the challenge of the highly-competitive American Le Mans Series. Led by team owners Fernandez and Tom Anderson, Lowe's Fernandez Racing is set to contend against factory efforts from Audi, Porsche, Mazda and other auto manufacturers with an all-new Acura ARX-01b chassis and the powerful, normally-aspirated 3.4-liter V-8 engine.

Fernandez and Diaz, both former open-wheel stars, expect to be in the thick of the battle for the coveted LMP2 point championship on the 12-race 2007 ALMS circuit.

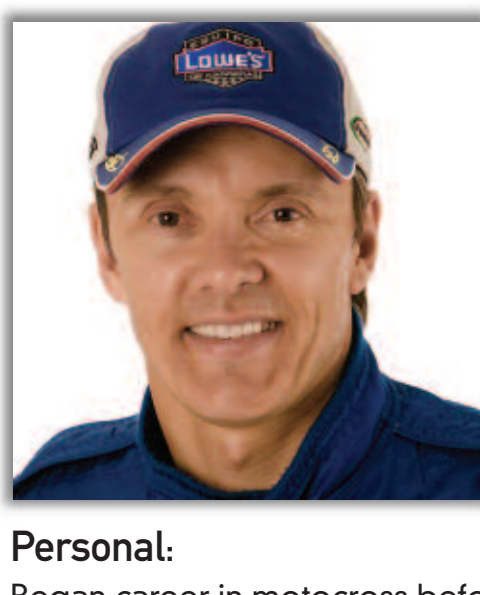
Lowe's, the second-largest home improvement retailer in the world, has been very successful in the motorsports arena for several years and sponsored the NASCAR Nextel Cup champion the past two years with Jimmie Johnson.

Lowe's Fernandez Racing participated in its first sports-car competition in 2006 with Fernandez and co-driver Mario Haberfeld piloting the Lowe's Daytona Prototype Grand-Am entry to victory on the tough Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course. The Lowe's machine also scored a win in a qualifying race at Phoenix and five top-five finishes that year.

Fernandez Racing was established in 2000 and won races in Champ Car, IndyCar and Grand-Am competition. Fernandez, one of Mexico's most celebrated athletes in the last 15 years, and co-owner Anderson have compiled an outstanding team that includes team manager Steve Miller and engineer John Ward. The team hopes to continue its winning tradition with its latest Lowe's Acura machine and make a strong challenge for the coveted LMP2 point championship.

Began career in motocross before moving to four wheels and his first auto race, the 24 Hours of Mexico... traveled to Europe to race open-wheel cars before coming to North America to compete in 1992... enjoyed a 12-year career at the top levels of open-wheel competition prior to moving to sports cars... ranked as one of Mexico's top athletes and celebrities... has won numerous awards, including "Athlete of the Year" in Mexico... recognized as one of the 300 most influential people in Mexico by a national magazine... became a team owner in 2000 with partner and racing veteran Tom Anderson... the team has won in Champ Car, IndyCar and Grand-Am competition.

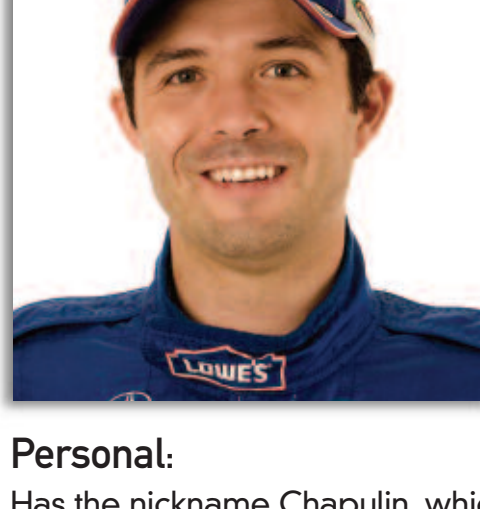
Career Highlights:

- Teamed with Mario Haberfeld to capture the first sports-car victory for Lowe's Fernandez Racing in the Grand-American Rolex Series race at Mid-Ohio in 2006
- Recorded five top-five finishes in his first season in the 2006 Grand-Am series
- Has made eight NASCAR Busch Series starts, driving for Team Lowe's Racing and Hendrick Motorsports in 2005 and 2006
- Competed in North American open-wheel racing for 12 years in the IndyCar and Champ Car series.

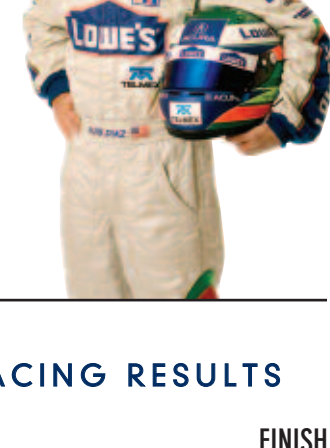


Personal:

Has the nickname Chapulin, which means "grasshopper" in Spanish... began racing karts at age 12... won various national karting championships in Mexico to establish himself as one of Mexico's brightest young racing talents... graduated to auto racing at age 18 in Mexico... a rising star in open-wheel competition, moved to the sports-car ranks in 2004, claiming eight wins over the next three years... was named "Driver of the Year" in Mexico in 2006.

Career Highlights:

- Proved to be a solid contender in his initial season in the American Le Mans Series in 2007
- Co-drove with Adrian Fernandez in the Lowe's Fernandez Racing Acura Lola sports car in the LMP2 class in the 2007 American Le Mans Series
- In his ALMS debut, finished second in LMP2 at the legendary Mobil 1 12 Hours of Sebring, helping Acura to a 1-2-4 finish
- Recorded podium finishes with Fernandez at Mid-Ohio and Laguna Seca in 2007
- Finished fourth in the 2007 ALMS LMP2 team point standings
- Driving the Chip Ganassi prototype, teamed with Scott Pruett to win the Grand-American Rolex team championship in 2006 and place second in the drivers championship
- Finished third in laps led by drivers in the Rolex Series in 2006
